

# FY 2015



ecember brings to a close another busy year at St. Andrew. Our ministries were very active throughout the year, reaching out to people in need, spreading God's word and providing services in the community. St. Andrew continues to be a very active parish community and we put our resources and facilities to good use doing God's work throughout the year.

In 2015 we continued to celebrate the "Year of Consecrated Life" declared by Pope Francis to run through February 2, 2016. We provided information throughout the year on religious vocations and invited various religious to speak on campus about their vocations. We celebrated Fr. David's 50th anniversary of his ordination in June. We continue to hope and pray that the youth of our parish will examine their conscious and if called, will choose a life of service in a religious vocation.

We continued new traditions started during the previous Papal "Year of Faith". We held a festive Pentecost reception to celebrate the birthday of the church, and held a Living Rosary event attended by both our parish and neighboring parishes. It is wonderful to see the spirit of the "Year of Faith" continue to live on in these activities.

December kicks off the Jubilee Holy Year of Mercy declared by Pope Francis to run Dec. 8, 2015 through Nov. 20, 2016. The parish staff and pastoral council are working on activities to help bring the message of mercy to our parish and our community.


Our parish community continues to face economic challenges. While the Raleigh and Apex area is rapidly growing, not everyone is able to take advantage of that growth. We still face poverty, homelessness, and unemployment in our parish and our community. In 2015, our Social Action ministries were very active in providing resources to provide aid and comfort to the community. Corporal Works of Mercy is one of the themes of the Holy Year of Mercy, so look for more opportunities to participate and help in 2016.

Financially our parish continued to be conservative with the resources provided by our parishioners. Our focus continued to be providing a safe, functional parish campus. A number of needed improvements to the campus grounds occurred in 2015, with several more planned for 2016. We continue to need your financial support to help run our parish and provide resources for the many initiatives, both local and diocesan, that require our support.

#### FY 2015 EXPENSES



### **Financial Summary**

Total revenue for FY 2015 (July 2014 thru June 2015) was above the budgeted amount due to higher building fund, and Columbarium contributions and Catheral and BAA rebates. The Offertory was up 7% over 2014. Expenses in FY 2015 were below budget and 17% lower than FY 2014, due to reductions in operating expenses and the retirement of two of our three loans from the Diocese. Only our parish hall renovation loan remains. We were also able to delay most of the budgeted capital improvements, which helped us to add to our Reserves in 2015.

Looking ahead, we still need to balance the increasing cost of running the diocese and the schools that we support, with the needs of our parish.

Our Financial Reserves at June 30, 2015 were at \$280k. These reserves are used to cover operating emergencies, building replacements, and Tuition Assistance. Our balances, especially in the Replacement Reserve, are lower than the best practice recomendations. Over time, as conditions allow, we plan on addressing this concern.

# FINANCIAL SUMMARY



#### BISHOPS ANNUAL APPEAL

Every year the Bishop's Annual Appeal raises money to sustain vital day-to-day ministries and programs in our diocese such as Catholic Charities, Hispanic Ministry, Campus Ministry, Faith Formation Programs and Lay Leadership formation.

For the 2015 BAA, St. Andrew's goal (set by the diocese), was \$239,075.88. Our parishioners very generous response was \$285,376.07 in pledges! This was accomplished by support from 840 households.



St. Andrew is one of three sponsoring parishes for our two K through 8 Catholic schools located at St. Mary Magdalene and St. Michael the Archangel.

Because we are a sponsoring parish, one-third of the available seats at both St. Mary Magdalene and St. Michael the Archangel schools are reserved for children of St. Andrew's families who are identified as contributors of time/talent/treasure.

St. Andrew contributes funds to the Catholic schools for each student identifed as a parishioner which enables that parishioner family to receive the discounted Catholic tuition rate. In addition, our parish tries to help families who are in need of assistance for a limited time due to unforeseen financial circumstances.





#### Faith Formation

#### FAITH FORMATION PROGRAMS

St. Andrew offers a full range of faith formation programs that serve parishioners from pre-school to adulthood:

- Elementary Faith Formation provides a structured, classroom environment for religious education for grades K - 5th grade. Classes run from September to May. Preparation for the sacraments of First Reconciliation and Eucharist typically occurs during the elementary years.
- Middle School Youth Ministry (JYM) for grades 6 8 encompasses religious education, socialization as well as service and spiritual pursuits. Classes are held September through May.
- High School Youth Ministry (TYM) for grades 9 12
  encompasses religious education, Confirmation Preparation, socials, service and spiritual retreats. Classes are held September through May.
- The Home Faith Formation Program affords families the option to do their faith study at home with parents as catechists. Students in grades 1 - 12 may participate.
- The Families with Special Needs ministry at St. Andrew builds a coalition of social and spiritual support within the Cary/Apex faith community to help families with special needs children of all ages grow in holiness to love and serve the Lord. Children with special needs are also prepared to be fully initiated into the Catholic Church.
- Adult Faith Formation includes RCIA, adult confirmation, Landings for returning Catholics, short courses for catechist enrichment, A.L.L. (Adults Living and Learning, 55+) and Marriage Enrichment opportunities. Several small groups meet throughout the week for faith sharing and/or Bible Study.

#### **Mothers Morning Out**

(MMO) is a nine-month program for 1 and 2 year olds that provides a safe, secure and fun environment for children.

Total enrollment for 2014-2015 is 51 children. The projected enrollment for 2015-2016 is 51. Eighty percent of the students for 2012-2013 are St. Andrew parishioners.

#### **Early Childhood Center**

ECC is a preschool for 3, 4 and younger 5 year olds where your child can learn the alphabet, dance and sing, and make new friends in a faith-based program.

Total enrollment for 2014-2015 is 111 children. The projected enrollment for 2015-2016 is 118. Eighty three percent of the students for 2014-2015 are St. Andrew parishioners.
