It's hard for me to believe that this is the second time I'm writing for our parish's annual report. THANK YOU for reading it – but especially thank you for making me feel at home here at St. Andrew's.

Also, thank you for all that you do, and for all that you give in terms of time, talent and treasure. It is because of you that we have accomplished so many things in the last year. Besides things like a new roof on the church and other various maintenance and improvement projects, we were able to purchase our beautiful new organ. I believe that there is a close link to the way that we pray and the way that we serve. Deepened prayer leads to more service and more love. Martin Luther said that for followers of Christ, there are three conversions necessary: the conversion of the heart, the mind, and the wallet. Billy Graham said, "Give me 5 minutes with a person's checkbook, and I will tell you where their heart is."

It is obvious for many of you that your heart is with God – your generosity is what makes St. Andrew's work. From time to time I remind you that the Bible says



that we should give 10% of our income away. (The church asks that 5% be given to your local parish, and the other 5 % to various other charities – BAA, BROWN BAG MINISTRY, WESTERN WAKE CRISIS MINISTRY, CATHOLIC CHARITIES, HAITI GOAT, HABITAT FOR HUMANITY, etc.) There are so many won-derful groups doing so many good things. I would encourage you to adopt one and invest some of your stewardship in it.

One more observation. As disciples of Christ, we recognize that our very life, our very existence, is a gift of God. This then leads us to ask not "Who are we?" but instead "Whose are we?" When we are God's, He has our heart, our mind, and our wallet; we respond to His immense love with the best that we can offer. We say WE WILL!

- Number of families registered on June 30, 2019 was 3089.
- In 2017, the old rectory was sold and a large individual donation was received to add ~\$ 150,000 to the Building Fund. There was no substantial work done on the facility that year, which is reflected in \$0 for Capital Expenses.
- 2018 saw the purchase of the organ, new siding and exterior paint, and a new roof on the church which are all Capital Expenses.
- In 2019 we have hired a parish bookkeeper, a music director, and the clergy have received a substantial raise in stipend for the first time in many years. Additionally, new flooring and paint in the CARE center, LED lighting, and restrooms in the church are in the budget as Capital Expenses. Significant increases in Parish Ministry investment includes increased charitable giving.

BISHOPS ANNUAL APPEAL

The Bishop's Annual Appeal is our yearly opportunity to support the work of the Catholic Church in Eastern North Carolina. This year we have raised over \$340,000 which is \$98,000 more than



our 2019 goal. 748 donors (around 25% of our households) gave an average gift of \$292. Over \$93,000 will be returned directly to our church for building maintenance and upgrades.

Financial Summary


This past fiscal year (2018-19) was a very exciting one for our parish. We purchased the new organ, replaced the church siding and roof, and began updating the lighting to greener and brighter solutions.

With the excitement generated by the *Who Will?* stewardship campaign, the offertory rose in the second half of the year. As a result, the amount of shortfall we forecast in last year's report was not experienced. We were able to cover all expenses with funds on hand and our BAA rebate.

This fiscal year has seen further capital improvements and increasing steps toward a more environmentally friendly campus. Finally, through careful use of our offertory and everyone's generosity, we have dramatically increased our charitable giving forecast.

We Will! continue to live the vision to Love God, Serve Neighbor, Nurture Disciples.



Faith Formation

FAITH FORMATION PROGRAMS AT A GLANCE

St. Andrew's offers a full range of faith formation programs that serve parishioners from pre-school to adulthood:

- Elementary Faith Formation provides a structured, classroom environment for religious education for grades K 5. Preparation for the sacraments of First Reconciliation and Eucharist typically occurs during the elementary years. Classes run from September to May.
- Middle School Youth Ministry (JYM) for grades 6 8 use the Catholic Connections for Middle Schoolers text from St. Mary's Press in a classroom setting. Along with formation and social activities they have opportunities for service both in the parish and the community. Classes are held September through April.
- High School Youth Ministry (TYM) for grades 9 12 transitioned this year to a Life Teen Relational Model. We have reinstituted our Youth Advisory Board and they have taken on an active role in peer ministry. Our teens have opportunities to participate in both parish and local service opportunities and social events. Classes are held September through April.
- The **Home Faith Formation Program** affords families the option to do their faith study at home with parents as catechists. Students in grades 1 12 may participate.
- The Families with Special Needs ministry at St. Andrew builds a coalition of social and spiritual support within the Cary/Apex faith community to help families with special needs children of all ages grow in holiness to love and serve the Lord. Children with special needs are also prepared to be fully initiated into the Catholic Church.
- Adult Faith Formation includes a year-round Inquiry and Catechumenate for RCIA, preparation of adult Catholics for Confirmation, and a Returning Catholics program. Catechist formation and enrichment is offered through short courses and the new Franciscan at Home program. A.L.L. (Adults Living and Learning) is a program for our 55+ parishioners. Programs for married couples include Marriage Encounter as well as other opportunities. Several small groups meet throughout the week for faith sharing and/or Bible Study. FORMED is also available to all parishioners.



Early Childhood Center

St. Andrew's offers morning programs for young children to learn and grow in a nurturing, faith-filled environment.

St. Andrew's offers a half day, nine-month program where children ages 18 months through 5 years old can learn and grow in a nurturing, faith-filled environment. The developmentally appropriate curriculum is designed to enhance social, emotional, physical and intellectual growth in young children. Child initiated and teacher



supported play is an essential component of the program. Being a Catholic center, Bible stories, prayer, and Catholic identity are incorporated into daily lessons.

Total enrollment for 2018-2019 was 155 children. The current enrollment for 2019-2020 is 156 children. 82% of the students for 2019-2020 are parishioners.
