### A Note From Father John

It's a bit hard for me to believe that I am writing to you as part of the annual report for the third time! As our fiscal year runs from July-June, we usually make this report in September, once we have a clear picture of where we are 12 months since our last reflection. Money may not be our favorite topic, but as we all realize, we can't do much of anything without it. Every year, I'm always surprised to look back and see all that happened in the course of one year.

I now know a number of the people that I have the privilege of sending on to God in funeral rites. Those are always moving experiences for me – and it's a difficult privilege to have some sense of a life well-lived as a disciple of Christ. And I always enjoy the baptisms – that hope for the future that a child represents. The looks on parents' faces are always priceless. We have been gradually celebrating First Communion with about 100 of our children –masks and all – it is STILL an inspiring sight. I was also thrilled with the opportunity to stand in for our Bishop and confirm 70 of our young (and a few not-so-young!) people. Weddings also remind me that folks continue to treasure those solemn vows, witnessing them in church. One brave couple even celebrated their wedding in May, at the height of the pandemic. It was videoed and provided a defiant word of hope in dark days. These are all particular highlights for me.

Some nuts and bolts realities: remodeling and refreshment of the church (ongoing as I write this), increasing our charitable giving by 10%, the purchase of a refrigerated truck to further expand the outreach of our BROWN BAG MINISTRY, we waived fees for Faith Formation (permanently!). All of this during a PANDEMIC! So, THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROSITY! And INGENUITY – David Legarth saw an opportunity to reuse our old pew cushions as sleep pallets for Church in the Woods, new ministries have been formed by YOU seeing a need and filling it. Despite all that has gone on in our world -- COVID-19, social unrest, election frenzy, you made it possible for us to operate IN THE BLACK once again. These challenges will continue for the foreseeable future. Despite all of them – we have stayed true to our mission – to *Love God, Serve Neighbor, and Nurture Disciples*. All of this can only be done with your generous stewardship.

It is humbling to be the pastor of such a generous community. It is very encouraging to observe where your hearts are, even in times of strife. We continue to rely on the SOURCE of our hope and salvation – Jesus, knowing that He accompanies us through every challenging moment (and the fun ones too!) We will be sharing more about stewardship and what it means to your fellow parishioners in the coming months. I invite you to reflect on this for yourself: What is Stewardship? How am I living the call to be a Christian Steward?

I want to thank those of you who have returned to Mass – it was SO difficult to celebrate the

mass before a camera without you. I'm glad to see you with your masks! (Although I prefer when we can see one another's faces). I also wish to assure those of you who have NOT returned, that you should only return WHEN YOU FEEL COMFORTABLE DOING SO. Let's not add unnecessary guilt to all of the other challenges we currently face. Staying connected to God in prayer (both private and communal – even when virtual), encouraging one another and holding on to hope are our Catholic strategies for challenging times. The Paschal Mystery reminds us that in our dyings there is promise of rising – ALWAYS.

WE WILL carry on, and we will once again celebrate together! Thank you for all you do.

- Number of registered families on June 30, 2020 2935
- We started a census effort in October 2018 which was completed at the end of July 2020. The reduction in the number of registered families, reflects those who are active members with verified contact information.
- In January, we purchased a new rectory and sold the townhome in April. The new house is a much more appropriate floorplan.
- The church renovations have begun, and will be completed by November 2020, so we incurred a portion of the expenses in fiscal 2020 and the rest in fiscal 2021.

#### **BISHOPS ANNUAL APPEAL**

The Bishop's Annual Appeal is our yearly opportunity to support the work of the Catholic Church in Eastern North Carolina. So far this year we have raised over \$305,000, \$60,000 more than our 2020 goal. 743 donors (around 32% of our households based on



8/31/2020 population) gave an average gift of \$257. Over \$57,000 (95% of the total amount over our goal at the end of the year) will be returned directly to our church in 2021. The remaining 5% will be placed in our Parish Reserve Endowment Fund at The Catholic Foundation.

# Financial Summary

This year, I think many would agree, has been the most unusual one in our parish history. The first half of our fiscal year (July-December 2019) was full of optimism: a new Music Director, formation programs thriving, a wonderful Christmas season. Even into January of 2020, we had no idea how quickly the world would turn.

Mid-March brought the shutdown and a dramatic drop in the offertory. We had a 16% increase in February which eroded to finishing the year around 8% over last year. Even though there was a decline, this is still a phenomenal result. You have kept your parish going – even thriving – through this pandemic. Offertory is rebounding and the staff is working very hard to make your in-person and at-home church experience meaningful. We are still able to continue pushing toward our vision to *Love God, Serve Neighbor, and Nurture Disciples.* 

Because of your commitment and stewardship, we have been able to continue our charitable giving and assistance to individuals in need, keep our staff working, maintain our facilities, and so much more with even more to come in the next year.

Thank you for continuing to say WE WILL!

## Faith Formation

#### FAITH FORMATION PROGRAMS AT A GLANCE

The Faith Formation programs at St. Andrew are central to our parish's mission to *Love God, Serve Neighbor, and Nurture Disciples.* 

- Elementary Faith Formation provides a variety of opportunities for children to learn to love Jesus and our Catholic faith. Children's Liturgy of the Word is offered weekly as a companion to the celebration of the Sunday liturgy and is geared toward preschool to elementary aged children. While Mass capacity is reduced, CLOW is pre-recorded and link for viewing is sent to all parishioners along with links to Children's Bulletins for each weekend. Since the Elementary Faith Formation curriculum we have chosen offers both in-person and online platforms, we are able to offer a faith formation experience that supports children and families in a distanced learning environment as needed. Sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion is another key component of this ministry.
- Middle School Youth Ministry (JYM) for grades 6-8: We will be using St. Mary's Press digital and virtual course Catholicism 101. It can be used as a companion to the Catholic Connections for Middle School text. It has an online component and a virtual zoom meeting with catechists. Once in -person class resumes, service, community and social components will as well. Weekly Bible Studies are offered via Zoom, where we discuss the coming week's readings.
- High School Youth Ministry (TYM) for grades 9-12: TYM will also be using curriculum from St. Mary's press for digital sessions led via Zoom meetings with adult leaders and peer ministers. Our high school teens will continue with the Life Teen Model but virtually with topical conversations along with discussions from Catholicism 101. Once in-person class resumes, service, community and social components will as well. Zoom Bible studies are also open to high school students.
- The Special Needs and Disabilities Ministry at St. Andrew builds a coalition of social and spiritual support within the Diocese of Raleigh. Families aren't just welcome in our church they belong here. Those with disabilities are invited to participate in all areas of parish life including the liturgy and faith formation programs. Support is tailored to individuals' gifts and needs.
- Adult Faith Formation includes a year-round Inquiry and Catechumenate for RCIA, preparation of adult Catholics for Confirmation, and a Returning Catholics program. Catechist formation and enrichment is offered through short courses and the new Franciscan at Home program. A.L.L. (Adults Living and Learning) is a program for our 55+ parishioners. Several small groups meet throughout the week for faith sharing and/or Bible Study, including both virtual and in-person opportunities. FORMED, an on-line streaming service, is also available to all parishioners.

### Early Childhood Center

St. Andrew's offers morning programs for young children to learn and grow in a nurturing, faith-filled environment.

St. Andrew's offers a half day, nine-month program where children ages 18 months through 5 years old can learn and grow in a nurturing, faith-filled environment. The developmentally appropriate curriculum is designed to enhance social, emotional, physical and intellectual growth in young children. Child initiated and teacher supported play is an essential component of the program. Being a



Catholic center, Bible stories, prayer, and Catholic identity are incorporated into daily lessons.

Total enrollment for the 2019-2020 school year was 156 children. The registration period for the 2020-2021 began healthy; however, as the pandemic continued preschool enrollment dropped to 88 children (61% of children are parishioners). This decline in enrollment is due to concern over COVID-19. We are committed to providing a safe, healthy learning environment for our staff and students.
